Welcome back to what is set to be another exciting school year here at Keaukaha Elementary! It feels so good to be back in session!

I am so excited to introduce you to a new teacher on campus and to inform you of internal changes:

Our students return to Keaukaha Elementary in their **school uniforms** again this year!! As a reminder, their uniform color is ROYAL BLUE (not black, brown or pink) and these blue uniforms are to be <u>used Monday through Thursday</u>, unless we have another activity planned for that day. Friday is Free Dress day for our students. Our Uniform Policy and Procedure information was sent out in the opening day documents for your review. Uniforms can be purchased throughout the year at Creative Arts. As a reminder, the ROYAL BLUE shirts are to be used by <u>students only</u> and will not be sold for adult use. Mahalo for honoring our students!! In addition, students may borrow a uniform from school if they do not have one at home. However, <u>this should be a rare occurrence</u>. Please ensure that your child has enough uniform shirts ready for school during the week. Mahalo for your assistance with this! Feel free to contact me if you have questions about our uniforms.

Keaukaha Elementary is moving away from Synervoice, our previous communication source with families. When two large earthquakes hit us last May, we realized that we needed a communication system that was easier for us to use during a crisis. We believe we found it!! Effective school year 2018-2019, ParentSquare will replace Synervoice at Keaukaha Elementary. ParentSquare is a method of communication we can use to get information out to our families in a more timely and easier manner. These messages will come to you in the form of a text and email. Yay!!! All non-emergency messages will go to the PRIMARY number listed on your child's emergency card, while any message we deem as an emergency will go to all the numbers listed. I can not stress enough how important it is to keep your contact information CURRENT with our school office. If your phone number changes, please notify us immediately. Mahalo!

Daily student attendance continues to be a primary focus area for us. Please make every effort to bring your children to school daily and on time. School starts at 8:00 am and students are considered tardy after 8:05 am. Of course, if they are sick, they should stay home. But if they are healthy and well, please have them in school with us. They could fall behind if they miss school unnecessarily. Any child with 15 or more days absent in a year will be considered chronically absent from school so let's work together to make sure they are in school. Mahalo for your attention to this!

Back-To-School Tips For Success

What's the secret to making sure your child has a successful school year? Here are some helpful tips:

Follow routines at home. Children thrive when they have a regular time to eat, sleep, play, read, do chores, etc.

Create daily rituals. Start school mornings eating breakfast together. Ask about school every evening. And end the day with a bedtime story.

Encourage playing by the rules. Know and talk about classroom rules. Never tell your child you think the rule is silly.

Stay up-to-date on school news. Read the information that comes home from your child's teacher and the school.

Tell the teacher about any changes at home, such as a new living arrangement or new baby.

Use email to contact the teacher. It minimizes "phone tag". Writing notes works, too.

Don't say negative things about the teacher in front of your child. Make it clear that you and the teacher are on the same "team."

Make homework a priority. Schedule a regular homework time and be there to support your child.

Don't over schedule your child.


Extracurricular activities can be great, but all children need some downtime, too.


Aloha Mai Kakou,


